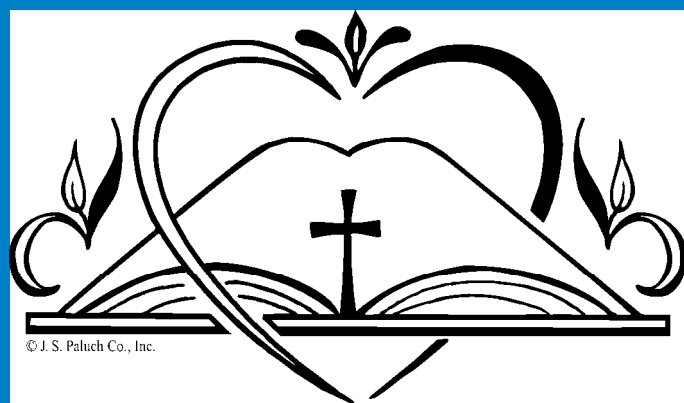

CONFESSIONS: Saturdays 4:00 to 5:00pm
EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.
BAPTISMS: Sunday Afternoon at 2:30pm on the First & Fourth Sunday of each month. Arrangements should be made by both parents in advance at the rectory with one of the priests. Both parents and sponsors must attend a meeting on the Third Monday at 8:00pm in the Rectory. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics.
MARRIAGES: Arrangements should be made at least four months in advance to assure time for the banns and the procurements of the necessary documents. It is the wish of the Church that all marriages be solemnized at a Nuptial Mass.
FUNERALS: All arrangements should be made at the rectory by a member of the immediate family. The family is encouraged to receive Holy Communion at the Funeral Mass.
SICK CALLS: Holy Communion will be brought to the sick upon request. In the case of any probable danger of death, call the priest immediately.
NEW PARISHIONERS: We welcome you to Melrose Park and particularly to the Family of Sacred Heart Parish. We ask that you register at your earliest convenience at the rectory.

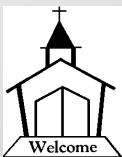

A Message



from the Pastor

1. He is Back!!!!!! Fr. Victor E. Cruz, our Associate Pastor is back from Columbia. As I mentioned earlier, his Passport and Visa was stolen in Columbia. He is back with his new Passport and Visa. He was little shaken-up and upset. After his arrival last Thursday night, he told me he feels very safe here at Sacred Heart. Welcome Back Fr. Victor Cruz!!
2. We have a whole newly renovated and resurfaced parking lot. The Archdiocesan supervisor has inspected and passed it. Meanwhile, the space between Rectory and Church (“gangway”) required some repairs and so new concrete was put in. The necessary work has been done. We apologize for any inconvenience that this may have caused you last weekend when the work was in progress.
3. Parish Pastoral Council: Our Parish Pastoral Council meetings will begin very soon. This year I look forward to having some ideas from you for our Pastoral Council meetings which are doable and achievable. We have a great and active parish council. If you have any ideas with regard to liturgy, social activities, new programs, Religious Education, School or Rectory, please give them to any of the parish council members whose names are found in the bulletin or call the Rectory.
4. Sacred Heart School enrollment for the year 2008-09 so far is 142 students including Pre-school children.
5. Mass Attendance: Every week you might have read or seen in the bulletin that we publish the number of people who attended weekend Masses. Many asked me why we do that. Few reasons:
 - a) we have 1250 and more registered families in the parish.
 - b) our Sunday Envelope company sends envelopes to 1250 families.
 - c) Returned envelopes at all the weekend Masses are approximately 200 or less each week
 - d) seating capacity in the Church is 800
 - e) we have Five Masses on weekends– 4 in English and one is Spanish.

Here are some serious questions, not to answer, but to reflect upon:

1. Have you registered as a family, only to have sacraments like Baptism, Confirmation, First Communion, Wedding, Funeral and a call for Last Rite at the moment of death?
2. Have you registered as a family only to attend Christmas, Ash Wednesday and Easter services once a year?
3. What other centers or places do you have where you are spiritually nourished, where you can worship God and return thanks to God, find peace in your heart, and are recognized as child of God?
4. As a registered member of a parish, are you committed to your parish?
5. If you have more serious questions than the above, please reflect on them too!

WHO IS PETER?

We are at something of a disadvantage this week, having a separation of seven days between last week’s Gospel reading and this week’s. In Matthew’s Gospel, these two passages follow immediately upon one another. So we don’t realize that, in only a hundred words or so, Jesus has moved from referring to Peter as the rock on which the church will be built to calling him “Satan.” So the point is Jesus founded the church on a “Satan”? Of course not. Jesus Christ founded, and continues to build—through the presence of his Body given to us, the church, by the Spirit of baptism—on human beings. He knows now, as he knew then, our frailness and built-in shortcomings. Today he begins his explanation of what his role as Messiah will mean during his last days in Jerusalem. And poor Peter leaps to the wrong conclusion, as many of us would, and still do. Peter is insistent upon following the conventional religious wisdom, the status quo, the commonly understood view of the Messiah. But it was this very view that Jesus came into this world to subvert.

WHO ARE WE?

The spiritual author C. S. Lewis once wrote, in reflecting on how hard it is to pray for one’s enemies as Christ commanded, that he had particular difficulty praying for people like Stalin or Hitler. This was because he had to come to terms with the fact that the very human failings that made them who they were are also present in each one of us. We can never be sure exactly how or why we are prevented from exercising that degree of evil and hatred; it is only through the grace and will of God that we don’t. All the weakness and ignorance present in Peter today are present in all of us. We could not name one single baptized follower of Christ in whom these mortal failings were not or are not present. It is helpful for us to be alert about this, lest we follow in the way of Peter today and fail to realize that to follow Christ means following him to Jerusalem. It means actively taking up a cross, making our bodies a living sacrifice, as Paul says. It means examining the religious status quo of our day to make sure it is consistent with the sometimes harsh message of Jesus’ good news. And it means making sure that we are more like last week’s Peter, professing faith in Christ revealed to us by God, so we may continue to be strong and sturdy stones on which the church continues to be built.

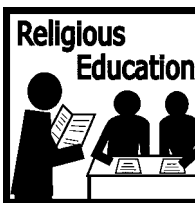

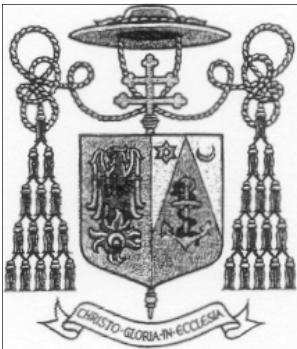
