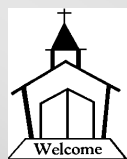

Anointing of the Sick is not Last Rite. The Church anoints those who are sick in mind, body and soul for healing and special prayers are said for healing. We all need some kind of healing whether we are sick or healthy. So please bring your beloved ones, home-bound and senior citizens for this special Mass and spread the word to your neighbors and relatives. There will be refreshments after the Mass.
6. **Oktoberfest:** What a great day to see smiling faces, to taste home made German food and other delicacies! May I suggest you to bring your own Beer steins to have some fun! Dress up and dance! Let's have some fun and friendship. October 18th, Saturday after 5:00 p.m. Mass. Save this Date
7. **We need you!** Sacred Heart Parish is looking for **YOU**, yes **YOU ARE** to become a Lector, an Extra-ordinary Communion Minister, Adult Altar Server, Greeter, Usher and Choir member. ANOINTING OF THE SICK

"It's just for old people." "You can only receive it if you're really sick with something like cancer." "You get it right before you die."

If you think the Anointing of the Sick is just for the extremely old or the critically ill, or if you assume the only time you can receive it is at the moment of death, you aren't alone. Most Catholics still think of the Sacrament that same way. Although the sacrament began as a ritual of healing, over time the emphasis shifted to the forgiveness of sins on the deathbed, when such forgiveness would be the final preparation for heaven. The Vatican II Council returned the original meaning to the sacrament by emphasizing that it is not only for those who are at the point of death, but for anyone, regardless of age, can receive the Sacrament if his/her health is seriously impaired. It can also be administered before surgery and, contrary to many people's belief, it can be received more than once if the original illness gets worse or if another serious sickness is diagnosed.

Today we are all aware that tensions, fear and anxiety about the future affect not only our mind but our body as well. These illnesses can be serious. They can move us to ask for the healing touch of Christ in the Sacrament of Anointing. Persons with the disease of alcoholism or persons suffering from other addictions can be anointed. So can those who suffer from various mental disorders. The anxiety before exploratory surgery to determine if cancer is present is a situation in which Christ's power can be invoked in the sacrament.

In these cases the person does not have to wait until the illness is so grave that he or she is in the hospital or institutionalized to celebrate the sacrament. Sacraments, after all, are community celebrations. It is preferable to celebrate them in the context of family and parish even before going to the hospital. The sick person has a better opportunity to appreciate the prayers and symbols of the rite when in her or his customary community.

Therefore, I invite all parishioners to bring members of your family, friends, relatives and neighbors for the celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the sick. It will be administered at the 6:00 PM Senior Appreciation Mass on OCTOBER 14th. Come, let us pray for all the sick.

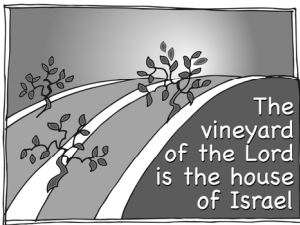

THE VINEYARD OF BEAUTY AND LIFE

The first sentence of today's Gospel parable can be easily overlooked: "There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower" (Matthew 21:33). It is difficult for us to imagine the enormous amount of time, money, and effort it must have taken for a construction project of this kind. Once completed, the vineyard must have been a beautiful place, not unlike the vineyards one can find in places like the Napa Valley in California. Vineyards are, by their very nature, places of beauty and life. The vineyard in today's Gospel, however, becomes the setting for treachery and murder. All too often the vineyard that is this fragile planet of ours likewise becomes a setting for treachery and murder.

STEWARDS OF THE VINEYARD

Isaiah's marvelous description of the vineyard reminds us of the creation passages from the book of Genesis. That description generates faint echoes of the oft-repeated line from Genesis: "and God saw how good it was" (Genesis 1:25). The sad reality is that we who are called to be good stewards of this vineyard sometimes make bad choices. Sometimes in our arrogance we fail to care for the vineyard of creation. Like the wicked tenants, we care more for our own personal gain than for the virtues of goodness and righteousness. Pope John Paul II used the term "the culture of death" to describe this kind of behavior. The parables we hear are meant to cut right to our hearts and force us to look squarely at our behaviors and attitudes. May this week's parable open our eyes to those times when we stray away from the goodness and beauty of God's vineyard and make decisions that support the culture of death. May we be strengthened in our efforts to become good stewards whose actions bring forth the fruits of life and love.

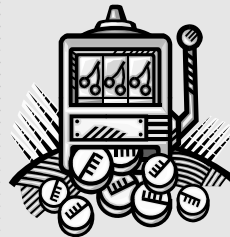

REFLEXION DOMINGO XXVII
