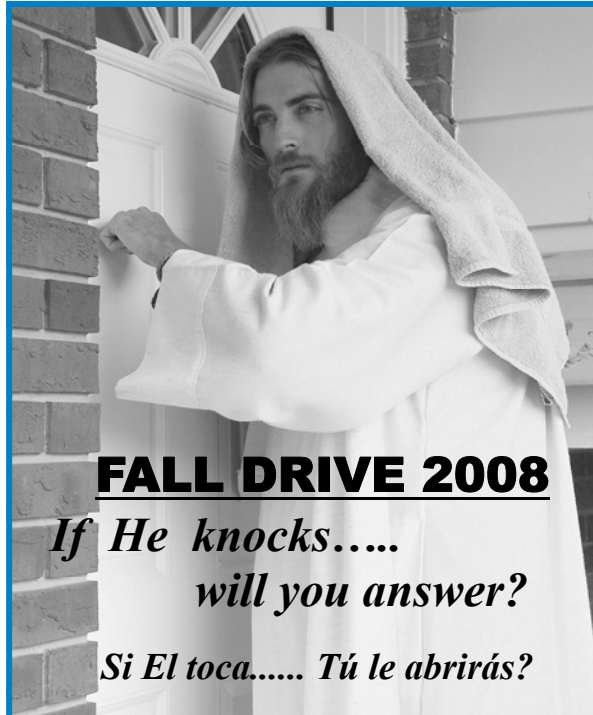
MISSION STATEMENT

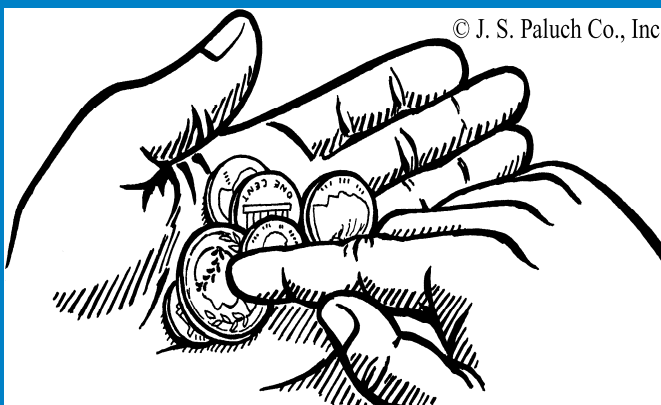

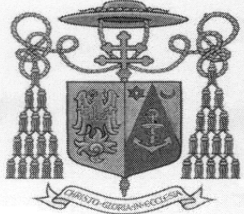

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Every year we celebrate World Mission Sunday on the third Sunday of October. This year, 2008, the Church in the United States marks the 100th anniversary of our no longer being a mission territory. In 1908, it was decided that we had reached a point of self-sufficiency as the Catholic Church in the United States. As we mark this anniversary, we celebrate our rich missionary history and reflect with gratitude on the debt we owe to the missionaries who journeyed here and to the Catholics who supported their efforts through the Pontifical Mission Societies.

The Second Vatican Council reminded us that we are all missionaries by reason of our Baptism. We are called to proclaim Christ to all people through our words, but more importantly by our lives. Today we pray for missionaries throughout the world and offer our financial support as a way to share in the mission of the Church.

In this Year of Saint Paul, Pope Benedict XVI has challenged us to imitate the zeal of St. Paul and devote ourselves anew to the work of mission in our home, neighborhood, work-place and wherever we find ourselves. It is a communion that needs to be extended through mission. Pray for all missionaries to be authentic ambassadors of Christ. REFLEXION DOMINGO XXIX

Este Evangelio de este Domingo marca el fin del Evangelio según Mateo y el comienzo de la vida de la Iglesia de Cristo. Aunque siempre se señala el día de Pentecostés como el comienzo de la Iglesia, no podemos pasar desapercibido este envío que Jesús hace a sus discípulos, pues constituye uno de los pilares más importantes en los que la Iglesia se sostiene: el envío misionero. Analicémoslo con atención. El lugar donde sucede es algo muy significativo, Galilea. Para Mateo había sido muy importante el cumplimiento de las Escrituras judías, pero ahora deja a un lado Jerusalén y señala a Galilea, tierra de Jesús, como el lugar desde donde ha de comenzar esta gran tarea de los seguidores de Jesús. Desde aquí podemos percibir la universalidad del mensaje de Jesús, y su apertura a otros pueblos y culturas.

Una vez reconocido, Jesús encomienda la más grande misión que la Iglesia jamás haya recibido: llevar el testimonio recibido por Jesús del amor de Dios Padre, la cercanía de Dios Hijo y la fuerza de Dios Espíritu Santo. En otras palabras Jesús pedía a sus discípulos que hicieran presente el Reino de Dios, y la manera de introducir este Reino sería a través del bautizo. El bautizo era una práctica que ya venían realizando algunos judíos y que quería significar el cambio de vida, la conversión; pero Jesús le añade a este significado la introducción a la vida de Dios, es decir el inicio en la vida del Espíritu.

Este mensaje se ha de llevar no sólo al pueblo judío, sino a todas las naciones. Así, Jesús se revela como salvador universal de toda la humanidad. La semilla que había sido sembrada en el Pueblo Israelita habría de dar fruto y convertirse en salvación para toda la humanidad en Cristo Jesús. Y para cumplir esta colosal misión, Jesús hace una promesa que de muchas maneras ha cumplido: "Yo estaré con ustedes hasta el fin del mundo". De mil maneras hemos visto a Jesús actuar en estos dos mil años de evangelización. En el envío del Espíritu Santo, en su presencia cada vez que se lee el Evangelio, a través de los sacramentos, donde se actualiza su presencia salvadora. Así, Jesús no nos deja solos, sino que nos sigue acompañando para cumplir con esta misión que constituye a la Iglesia: dar testimonio de Jesucristo e instaurar su Reino en toda la Tierra.

INFORMACION GENERAL: Sigamos orando en casa para que Dios dé la Salud a nuestro Pastor Padre Víctor Miranda.
