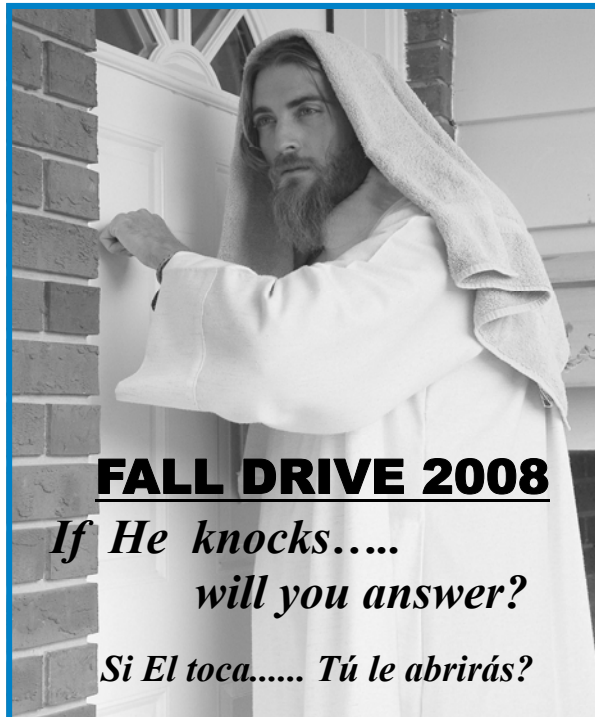
## MISSION STATEMENT

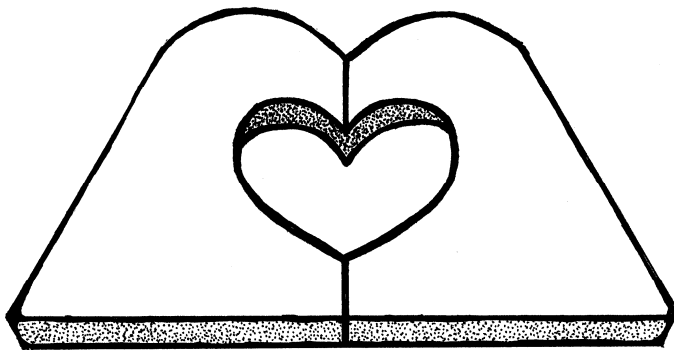

1. We all love and like to salute our armed forces who have kept us safe. Sacred Heart Parish would like to honor them and thank them for their service. They all will be remembered and honored on Veterans Day, November 11th, 2008 at a special Mass at 9:00 a.m. I would like you to give us the names of all the veterans of war/s and the names of all member/s or relative/s of

your family who are in the service, now in Iraq, Afghanistan and other parts of the world. Please write their name/s and rank legibly. Their names will be printed in our bulletin and all are asked to pray for them and their families.

2. All Saints Day—November 1. Traditionally, it was a Holy Day of Obligation but this year it is not a Day of Obligation since it falls on Saturday. Saturday Weekend Masses as usual at 8:00am and 5:00 p.m.
3. All Souls Day—November 2. This year All Souls Day falls on Sunday. We remember all the departed members of our families on this day. This year, we will have a special remembrance of all the departed souls at 9:00 a.m. Mass. At this Mass, a member of the deceased’s family will be carrying a lighted candle in the procession at the beginning of Mass and the names of the deceased will be called during the Prayers of the Faithful. Special prayers will be offered. The deceased family may take home the candle in memory of their beloved departed.
4. I am happy to announce that the number of children in Religious Education has reached beyond 250. I thank our DRE, Mr. Arnolando Martinez for his hard and efficient work, for finding more volunteers and most importantly, his prayerful dedication to the Religious Education of our children. We may not be able to register children herein after for this year.

**“HOME SUPPORT FOR OUR TROOPS”**

**In an effort to show our support for our troops “in Harms Way” we are hoping our parishioners might remember them while out shopping, or just wanting to show them in some way our true appreciation for keeping safe.**

These are some items they would enjoy from home, sorted into 6 categories, that soldiers do not have readily available to them. **TOILETRIES:** Hand wipes, toothpaste and tooth brushes, mouth wash and breath strips, dental floss, shampoo (no-rinse and regular) skin lotion, sun block, chapstick, soap, shaving gel and deodorant (non-aerosol), disposable razors. **SPECIAL NEEDS:** “Rain-X” anti-fog (for goggles from any dept., or auto store), sunglasses (any type), letters of “support”. **STATIONARY:** Birthday, anniversary and thank you cards (unsigned), paper, pencils, pens, envelopes. **FOOD:** Energy drinks (canned), Gatorade (or “Propel” packets, Kool-aid, Louisiana sauce, candy (bars and hard), peanuts (any type), sunflower and pumpkin seeds, gum, tic-tacs, Twinkies, Ding-Dongs, etc., potato and/or Corn chips, canned sardines, tuna, anchovies, Spaghettios, chicken and/or Ramen noodle soups, snack crackers, “slim-jims” or beef jerky, protein bars, coffee, creamer (powdered), sugar, “Equal” or “Sweet N Low” packets. **CLOTHES:** White T-shirts, knee-cut socks **RECREATIONAL:** Nerf footballs, playing cards, batteries (AA or AAA most requested), DVD’s & CD’s (used or new), playstation, X-Box games (used or new), books, word puzzles, travel games

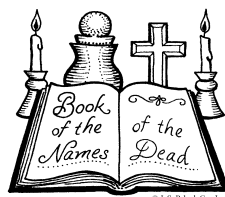

## Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### LOVE OF GOD

It's easy to tell when two people love each other. They like to be near each other and spend time together. They share intimate thoughts and feelings. They enjoy making each other happy. And knowing that they are loved allows them to reach out to other people and treat them with love and respect.

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus tells us that the greatest law is to love God with our whole heart and soul and mind. What does it mean to love God? Certainly it means spending time together by reading and reflecting on God's holy word. It also means sharing our thoughts and feelings with God in prayer and listening for God's voice. Where do we go to be close to God? We join God's people in worship in the church, rest in God's presence in the Blessed Sacrament, discover God in the wonder of creation and the miraculous moments of daily life. What can we do to make God happy? How do we, like the Thessalonians, "serve the living and true God" (1 Thessalonians 1:9)?

### LOVE OF NEIGHBOR

The reading from Exodus makes it very clear that we serve God by serving those who are oppressed or in need. Jesus makes it more personal—we are to love our neighbors. That means those with whom we work and play and live. When we spend time with God we can't help but experience God's great love for us. And knowing that we are loved by God should make it easy to reach out in charity and justice to our neighbors both near and far away.

Thus, love of neighbor flows naturally from those who love God. We cannot truly say that we love God unless it shows in loving relationships and compassion to those in need. At the same time, we cannot maintain our love of neighbor unless we take time to drink from the wellspring of God's refreshing love

## REFLEXION DOMINGO XXX: EL MANDAMIENTO MAS GRANDE

El Evangelio de hoy nos presenta la afirmación necesaria de la vivencia de dos amores importantes para crecer en el camino hacia Dios. En esta identificación de los dos amores ha existido una evolución dividida en tres etapas:

1ª Etapa: "Prójimo" es el pariente de la misma raza. El Viejo Testamento enseñaba la obligación de "¡amar al prójimo como a uno mismo!" (Lv19, 18). En aquel tiempo la palabra prójimo era sinónimo de pariente. Se sentían obligados a amar a todos los que hacían parte de la familia, del mismo clan, del mismo pueblo. Pero en lo referente a los extranjeros, o sea, los que no pertenecían al pueblo hebreo, el libro del Deuteronomio decía: "Podrás exigir el préstamo al extranjero, pero en cuanto a tu derecho con tu hermano, lo dejarás vencer (pariente, prójimo)" (Dt 15,3).

2ª Etapa: "Prójimo es aquél a quien me acerco o el que se me acerca. El concepto de prójimo sí es el mismo. Y en el tiempo de Jesús hubo una discusión acerca de "¿quién es mi prójimo?" Jesús responde con la parábola del Buen Samaritano (Lc 10,29-37), en la cuál el prójimo no es el pariente o amigo, sino cualquiera que se acerca a nosotros, independientemente de la religión, del color, de la raza, del sexo o de la lengua. ¡Tú debes amarlo!

3ª Etapa: La medida del amor hacia el "prójimo" es amar como Jesús nos ha amado. Jesús había dicho al doctor de la ley: "¡No estás lejos del Reino!" (Mc12,34). El doctor ya estaba vecino, porque de hecho, el Reino consiste en unir el amor de Dios con el amor al prójimo, como ya había afirmado un doctor ante Jesús (Mc 12,33). Pero para poder entrar en el Reino debía dar un paso más. En el Viejo Testamento el criterio del amor hacia el prójimo era el siguiente: "Ama a tu prójimo como a ti mismo". Jesús ensancha este criterio y dice: "Este es mi mandamiento: que os améis unos a otros como yo os he amado. Ninguno tiene un amor más grande de éste: ¡dar la vida por los amigos!" (Jn 15,12-13). Ahora, en el Nuevo Testamento el criterio será: "Amar al prójimo como Jesús nos ha amado". Jesús ha interpretado el sentido exacto de la Palabra de Dios y ha indicado el camino para una convivencia más justa y más fraterna
