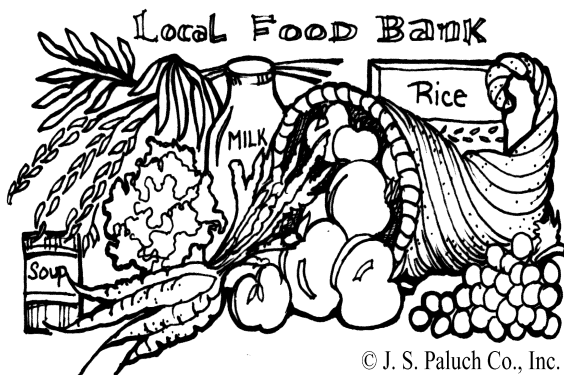

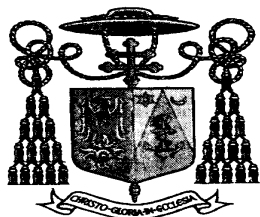

## ¡VIVA CRISTO NUESTRO REY!

Es de notarse todas las figuras que Jesús utiliza en este pasaje: primero se presenta como el Hijo del Hombre que vendrá al final de los tiempos lleno de gloria, señalando con esto su carácter de Mesías; después se compara con el Pastor que conoce y apacienta a sus ovejas; después como el rey y juez que juzgará quién habrá de entrar en su Reino y quien no lo podrá hacer. Si buscáramos un factor común entre todas estas figuras, llegaríamos a la conclusión de que Jesús es todo esto porque ha sabido entregar su vida por su pueblo. Me explico, Jesús se puede proclamar como Mesías, Pastor y Rey del pueblo de Dios, porque él ha entregado su vida hasta llegar a la muerte para que este pueblo tenga vida. He ahí el fundamento de su reinado, su servicio, su entrega y su solidaridad llevada hasta el extremo. Así podemos comprender aquellas palabras que dijo: “El Hijo del Hombre no ha venido a ser servido sino a servir y a dar la vida en rescate por todos”.

Otro elemento importante es la cantidad de veces que Jesús se identifica con quienes se asemejan al Reino; por ejemplo con los niños: “Cualquiera que en mi nombre reciba a un niño como éste, a mí me recibe”; o con sus enviados: “El que los recibe a ustedes a mí me recibe, y el que me recibe a mí recibe al que me envió”; y en este pasaje, con el hambriento, el sediento, el desnudo, el encarcelado, etc.

Con estos dos elementos: el servicio como signo esencial de Cristo y su identificación con el hermano, podremos comprender mejor el mensaje del Evangelio. Cristo vendrá a pedir cuentas a cada quien de lo que ha recibido, pues es él como Dios que ha “repartido” los talentos en su Reino, pero la manera en que hemos de responderle no será con nuestras palabras sino con nuestras obras. Es decir, lo esencial del seguimiento de Cristo ha de ser la caridad al prójimo, al necesitado; y de ahí se ha de derivar el sentido de todas nuestras acciones como cristianos e hijos del Reino de Dios.

Este domingo, en que celebramos la Solemnidad de Cristo Rey, nos ha de servir para pensar ¿en dónde estoy basando mi realización como cristiano? ¿en mi asistencia a misa, en mis oraciones de piedad, en evitar matar, fornicar y robar? Nada de esto tiene sentido si no va acompañado de una buena “dosis” de actos de caridad concretos. El nombre de cristiano no puede separarse de la actitud de servicio y solidaridad con el necesitado. Hay que recordar que todos nosotros, desde nuestro bautismo, somos reyes junto con Cristo, pero que este reinado se ejerce en el servicio y el amor concreto y real al hermano. Si yo asisto a misa, es precisamente para alimentarme y poder amar con mayor plenitud a los que me rodean; si yo rezo un rosario es para recordar la obra redentora de Cristo, y motivado por ella imitar su testimonio; si yo no mato, no basta; hay que promover y defender la vida. Y así, cada una de nuestras actividades las hemos de realizar, tratando de hacer vida esta enseñanza de Jesús que nos dice: “El Hijo del Hombre no ha venido a ser servido sino a servir y a dar la vida en rescate por todos”.

Tal vez podamos esta semana esforzarnos por servir como Cristo sirvió; con su sensibilidad para reconocer las necesidades de los que lo rodeaban, con su esmero por hacer que todos se sintieran aceptados por él, con esa solidaridad que lo llevó a dar su vida por cada uno de nosotros. Entonces sí podremos gritar con nuestras vidas: “Viva Cristo Rey”.
