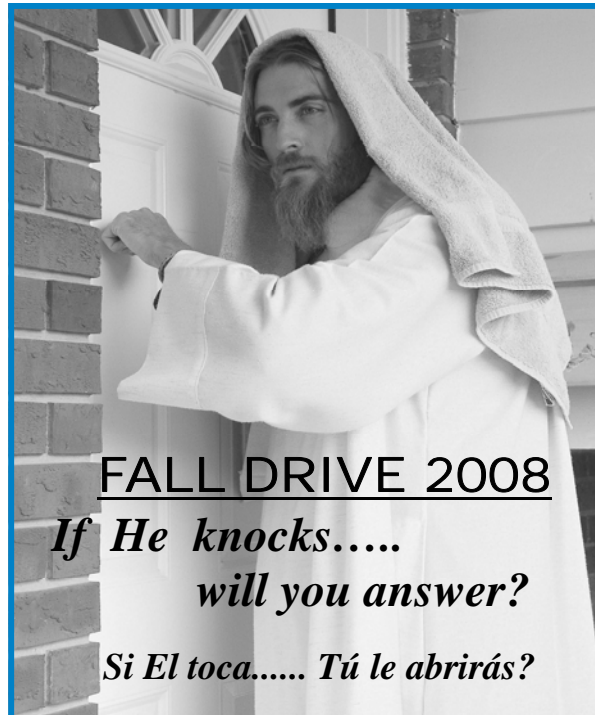
## MISSION STATEMENT

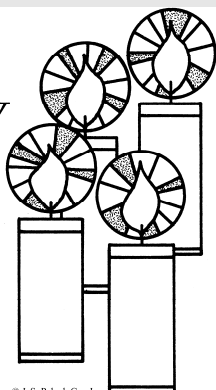

1. All articles or news or information should be in writing. Bulletin copy should be brief and to the point. The Pastor or Bulletin Editor will have a right to editing and in some extra-ordinary cases, an approval from the Pastor.
2. It is NOT the responsibility of the bulletin editor to prepare your bulletin copy.
3. No information is taken over the telephone.
4. It is preferred that you submit your copy via e-mail
5. All copy must be in writing or via e-mail and received in the Parish Office the Monday BEFORE the Sunday you desire publication.
6. Holiday Schedule: You need to submit your copy to the Rectory Office two weeks early. No last minute requests.

If you desire a bi-lingual (English and Spanish) it is your responsibility to translate the copy and forward it to the Rectory Office.

## **DOMINGO II DE ADVIENTO**

Este domingo el tema es sobre el tiempo de Dios y nuestro tiempo. Para introducirlos, comienzo con un cuento de buen humor:

Una vez un hombre tuvo una conversación con Dios. Le dijo, "Señor, siempre me he preguntado sobre el tiempo. ¿Cómo son mil años para ti?" Dios respondió, "Para mí, mil años son como un segundo."

Más atrevido, el hombre pregunto: "Y ¿qué del dinero? Para ti ¿cómo es un millón de dólares?" Dios contestó, "Para mí, un millón de dólares es como un centavo"

El hombre se entusiasmó y dijo, "Señor, ¿puedes darme uno de estos centavos?" Dios contestó, "No hay problema, pero tendrás que esperar un segundo."

Hoy San Pedro nos hace recordar que el tiempo de Dios es diferente que el nuestro. "Para el Señor," dice San Pedro, "un día es como mil años y mil años como un día." Pedro nos exhorta a ser pacientes porque Dios es paciente con nosotros. "El día del Señor llegará," nos asegura.

Paciencia es una virtud bien importante. Significa esperar, sacrificar una satisfacción inmediata por un bien mayor. Impaciencia, por otro lado, es la indisposición de esperar, el querer todo, ahora mismo. Muchos de nuestros problemas vienen de la impaciencia.

Adviento es un tiempo precisamente para aprender paciencia. Es una temporada de "esperanza alegre." Hoy hemos prendido la segunda vela de la Corona de Adviento. La Corona (en su forma moderna) fue inventada para enseñar paciencia. Un hombre llamado Johann Hinrich Wichern (1808-1881) había fundado un hogar para niños de la calle en Hamburgo. Los niños le preguntaban cuántos días quedan hasta Navidad. Como respuesta, desarrolló la Corona de Adviento con sus velas para dar a los niños alguna idea.

Usamos la Corona de Adviento para un propósito semejante - para aprender paciencia. Desde luego, a veces las cosas parecen oscuras, pero la Corona de Adviento dice que la luz de Cristo ha venido - y que crecerá. Necesitamos aprender el tiempo de Dios - evitar los pecados de impaciencia que causan tanto daño. Si esperamos pacientemente, nos dará toda cosa buena. Enséñanos, Señor, esperar hasta el momento apto. Enséñanos, Señor, la esperanza alegre.
