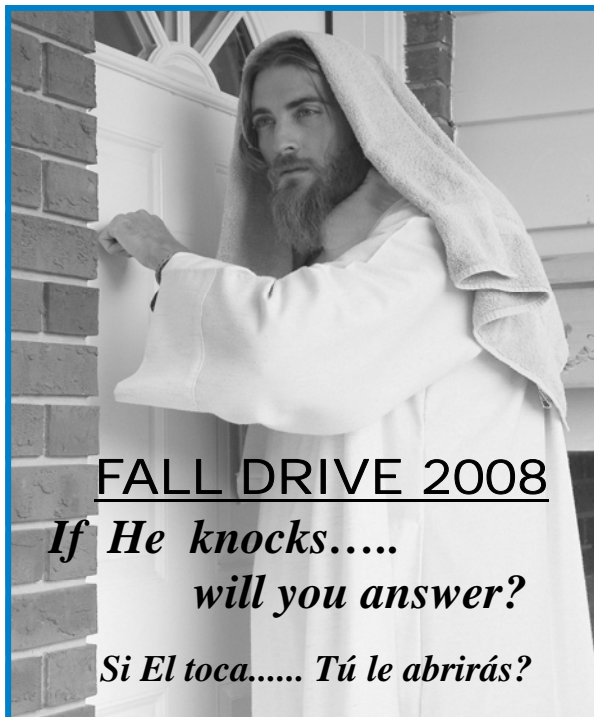
## MISSION STATEMENT

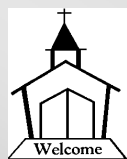

Communal Reconciliation Service **DOES NOT** include General Absolution. Rather, in communal penance service the penitent receives personal absolution from the confessor. The procedure is simple: the penitent comes forward and asks for reconciliation from one of the priest confessors. The penitent expresses sorrow for her/his sins and asks for absolution. The confessor then speaks the words personally to each penitent.

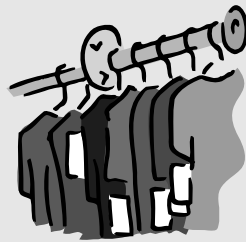

### DOMINGO III DE ADVIENTO

La Iglesia nos propone hoy una lectura del Evangelio según San Juan, que está en sintonía con la del domingo anterior.

a. Volvemos a ver la figura de Juan el Bautista, que en este relato parece como “un hombre enviado por Dios”, como el que vino para “dar testimonio de la luz, para que todos creyeran en él”. Estas frases, nos presentan la misión del Bautista, quien sabe reconocerse así mismo como el testigo de la luz, enviado para cumplir una función altísima al presentar al Cordero de Dios.

b. El Bautista confiesa que su misión es preparatoria. Ante los representantes de las autoridades que interrogan a Juan para saber quién es él, Juan simplemente reconoce su papel y su pequeñez frente a aquel que está ya en medio de las gentes, pero que aún no conocen refiriéndose a Jesús. El texto quiere presentar a Jesús como el Mesías anunciado por los profetas, y nos hace ver en la persona de Juan el Bautista al mensajero, a “la voz que grita en el desierto: preparen el camino del Señor”, recurriendo a Isaías 40, 3.

c. Preparar el camino del Señor, quiere significar la preparación tanto individual como comunitaria para tener el encuentro con Dios. Ya el domingo anterior, en el relato de San Marcos hemos indicado cómo el desierto es el lugar del encuentro amoroso con Jesús, por ello, el Bautista proclama con fuerza que es necesario aventurarse y dejar las comodidades y las distracciones de los poblados para ir al desierto y allí, despojados del pecado, estar en disposición de reconocer al Hijo de Dios que está entre nosotros, la luz verdadera que ilumina a todo hombre.

d. Está en medio de ustedes y no le conocen: Continuando con la presentación del rostro del esperado Juan Bautista lanza la desconcertante afirmación: “Entre ustedes hay uno que no conocen”. La escena contiene elementos notables:

- Juan, el “enviado por Dios” se ve obligado a negar varias veces que él sea el Mesías. La cerrazón y la lógica obstinada del hombre impiden “reconocer” y distinguir entre enviado y Señor.
- El símbolo de Cristo es desde un inicio el ser luz para “toda la humanidad”. Más adelante, Esta luz brilla en las tinieblas, y las tinieblas no han podido apagarla.

Quienes escuchan al Bautista forman una mezcla de devoción y fe a la par de insensibilidad y prejuicio. Los dos grupos que le escuchan representan las dos opciones que a lo largo de la vida de Cristo se irán entretejiendo como fe o rechazo... Podemos hacer una meditación con la ayuda de las siguientes preguntas:

- ¿Hemos reconocido a Jesús que está en medio de nosotros, en cada hombre o mujer que vive a nuestro lado?
- ¿Vivimos con la certeza de que Jesús es la luz verdadera que nos muestra el camino que lleva a Dios?
- ¿Hemos asumido la tarea que tenemos como cristianos de ser testigos de Jesús, al igual que el Bautista? ¿Cómo hemos anunciado a las gentes que Jesús está ya presente entre nosotros?
