**CONFESSIONS:** Saturdays 4:00 to 5:00pm

**EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION:** The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.

**BAPTISMS:** Sunday Afternoon at 2:30pm on the First & Fourth Sunday of each month. Arrangements should be made by both parents in advance at the rectory with one of the priests. Both parents and sponsors must attend a meeting on the Third Monday at 7:00pm in the Rectory. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics.

**MARRIAGES:** Arrangements should be made at least four months in advance to assure time for the banns and the procurements of the necessary documents. It is the wish of the Church that all marriages be solemnized at a Nuptial Mass.

**FUNERALS:** All arrangements should be made at the rectory by a member of the immediate family. The family is encouraged to receive Holy Communion at the Funeral Mass.

**SICK CALLS:** Holy Communion will be brought to the sick upon request. In the case of any probable danger of death, call the priest immediately.

**NEW PARISHIONERS:** We welcome you to Melrose Park and particularly to the Family of Sacred Heart Parish. We ask that you register at your earliest convenience at the rectory.

**CHANGE OF ADDRESS:** IF YOU LEAVE THE PARISH OR MOVE TO A NEW ADDRESS, PLEASE NOTIFY THE RECTORY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

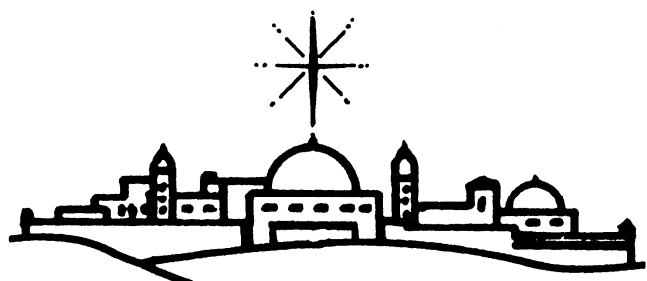

**TODAY'S READINGS**

**First Reading** — I will fix a place for my people. I will plant them so that they may dwell in their place without further disturbance (2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8b-12, 14a, 16).

**Psalm** — For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord (Psalm 89).

**Second Reading** — To the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, be glory forever and ever (Romans 16:25-27).

**Gospel** — Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word (Luke 1:26-38).

**GOD'S PROMISE**

The lengthy passage from Samuel is a wonderful exposition of God's promise to the house of David: that his throne would forever be gloriously occupied by his descendants. Hidden in the mystery of the prophecy is the promise of the Savior, the Messiah, Son of God and Son of David. The prophet Nathan, speaking in God's name, poetically turns around David's plan to build a house for God, and announces God's plan to build a "house," that is, a dynasty for David. From this house of David will come the Messiah, the Christ, not in kingly splendor as David ruled, but as a humble man, destined to rule forever and over all. When God gives a gift, it's amazing what we are given—so different from what we ever could have imagined.

entre las mujeres**

## DOMINGO IV DE ADVIENTO

- La visita del ángel a María evoca las visitas de Dios a varias mujeres del Antiguo Testamento: Sara, madre de Isaac (Gn 18,9-15), Ana, madre de Samuel (1 Sam 1,9-18), la madre de Sansón (Jueces 13,2-5). A todas ellas fue anunciado el nacimiento de un hijo con una misión importante en la realización del plan de Dios.

- La narración empieza con una expresión "En el sexto mes". Es el sexto mes de embarazo para Isabel. La necesidad concreta de Isabel, una mujer ya avanzada en edad que va a tener a su primer hijo, con un parto a riesgo, es el telón de fondo de todo este episodio. Y ella lo menciona al comienzo (Lc 1,26) y al final de la visita del ángel (Lc 1,36.39).

- El ángel le dice: "¡Alégrate!, ¡Llena de gracia! ¡El Señor está contigo!" Palabras similares fueron dichas a Moisés (Ex 3,12), a Jeremías (Jr 1,8), a Jedeón (Jz 6,12) y a otras personas con una misión importante en el plan de Dios. María se queda extrañada ante este saludo, y tratar de saber el significado de aquellas palabras. Es realista. Quiere entender. No acepta cualquier inspiración.

- El ángel responde: "¡No temas, María!" Como en la visita del ángel a Zacarías, el ángel recuerda aquí que el primer saludo de Dios es siempre: "¡No temas!" Luego el ángel recuerda las promesas del pasado que se cumplirán mediante el hijo que va a nacer y que debe recibir el nombre de Jesús. Será llamado Hijo del Altísimo y en él se realizará el Reino de Dios. Esta es la explicación del ángel para que María no tenga miedo.

- María tiene conciencia de la misión que está recibiendo, pero sigue siendo realista. No se deja embalar por la grandeza de la oferta y mira su condición. Analiza la oferta a partir de los criterios que tiene a su disposición. Humanamente hablando, no es posible: "¡Cómo podré ser madre si no tengo relación con ningún hombre?"

- El ángel explica que el Espíritu Santo, presente en la Palabra de Dios desde el día de la Creación (Génesis 1,2), consigue realizar cosas que parecen imposibles. Por esto, el Santo que va a nacer de María será llamado Hijo de Dios. El milagro se repite hoy. Cuando la Palabra de Dios es acogida por los pobres, algo nuevo acontece por el poder del Espíritu Santo. Algo tan nuevo y sorprendente como que un hijo va a nacer de una virgen o un hijo va a nacer de una mujer ya entrada en edad como Isabel, de la que todos decían que ¡no podía tener hijos! Y el ángel añade: "¡Ahí tienes a tu parienta, Isabel: se encuentra ya en el sexto mes del embarazo!"

- La respuesta del ángel aclara todo para María, y ella se entrega: "¡He aquí la sierva del Señor! Hágase en mí según su Palabra". María usa para sí el título de Sierva, sirvienta del Señor. Este título viene de Isaías, que presenta la misión del pueblo no como un privilegio, sino como un servicio a los otros pueblos (Is 42,1-9; 49,3-6). Más tarde, Jesús definirá también su misión como un servicio: "No vine para ser servido, sino para servir" (Mt 20,28). ¡Aprendió de su Madre!
