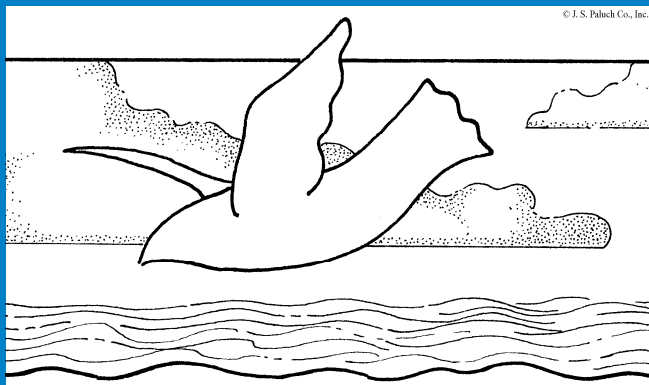

MORE PARISH INFORMATION

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.

BAPTISMS: All Baptism arrangements must be made at the rectory office beforehand. All parents and godparents should be practicing Catholic Christians.

English Baptisms are at 2:30pm on the First and Fourth Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 3rd Monday of the month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

Spanish Baptisms are at 1:00pm on the Second Saturday of each month, or after the 12:30pm Mass on the Second Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 1st Monday of each month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

WEDDINGS: Arrangements need to be made with a parish priest or deacon at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for parishioners, but special situations will be considered.

FUNERALS: Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director. We have the Book of Funeral Readings at the rectory for families who wish to look them over. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

SICK CALLS: If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are seriously ill, don't wait too long. If someone requests Holy Communion, it will usually be brought by a Minister of Care.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome to Sacred Heart Parish! Please register in the rectory office and be counted!

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: IF YOU LEAVE THE PARISH OR MOVE TO A NEW ADDRESS, PLEASE NOTIFY THE RECTORY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

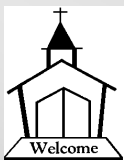

Reflections for this week...

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Lord's Baptism. It marks the end of the Christmas Season and the beginning of His public ministry. In the liturgical year Jesus grows up fast!!! In celebrating the Lord's Baptism, we recall our own Baptisms by renewing our Baptismal Promises and a Sprinkling Rite, in place of the usual Profession of Faith. We have indeed been baptized with water and the Holy Spirit!!! We are indeed children of God!!!

As I said last week we have plans for our Altar Servers! All Altar Servers are asked to come to a short but very important meeting, on Friday, January 15th, at 7pm SHARP, in church. Fr. Friedl, Deborah Barnish, and Sr. Nila will be there. The meeting will consist of a short practice and Christmas Gifts! Better late than never!!! See you there!

We will continue our Catholics Come Home effort until Jan. 17th. The pamphlets and other information are at the back of church and sometimes even a nice "welcomer" is back there. The pamphlets are not meant for active parishioners, but are meant to be given to relatives, friends or acquaintances who have lapsed in the faith. Please reach out and pray for success! Here is a short reminder letter we got from the diocese on the topic...

Today's Gospel story of the Baptism of the Lord seems so fitting not that we have entered the second half of the Catholics Come Home evangelization initiative. During the time of John the Baptist people were waiting in great anticipation for the coming of the Christ. They continued to live in hope that God would save them just as he had promised Abraham and all the generations that came afterward. It was their faith in God and their hope for the future that kept them watchful for the messiah.

Today we have the joy of knowing Jesus, the Christ through our baptism and in our practice of faith. No longer do we wait for salvation for we have tasted it in the Eucharist and felt it in the water and oil of our Baptism. Jesus called us to go out and spread the Good News. That is the reason for the Catholics Come Home evangelization effort. Today we have an opportunity to talk to others about our faith by simply asking, "Have you seen those commercials on TV?" Just by getting people to talk about Catholics Come Home you may be planting the seeds of faith that could blossom in the future.

It's hard to believe, but we are preparing letters and making plans for next year's school registration. We are looking for more students!!! We need more students!!! Please spread the word!!!

Another "hard to believe" is that it is time for First Confessions for our young ones. Spanish First Confessions will be on Jan. 16th and English ones on Jan. 23rd. Both are at 10am. Please pray for our young penitents!

Christmas Season is now over for Christians. Time to take the decorations down!!! Have you noticed all the Valentine Candy at the stores? The commercial world doesn't miss a beat!

BAPTIZED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT AND FIRE

What do all these epiphanies have to do with us? Titus assures us that the same Spirit of God who renews the universe, renewed the covenant, and descended upon Jesus has been "richly poured out on us" in "the bath of rebirth." With Jesus, we have been baptized "with the Holy Spirit and fire."

Those of us who were baptized as infants may not remember our baptism; even less might we remember our experience of God made manifest in us that day. Yet every time our community prays the Eucharistic Prayer and shares in Holy Communion the Spirit descends upon us again, pouring out the divine life that renews and "fires" us. As we move into Ordinary Time we will hear how the Spirit propelled Jesus forth to proclaim the Good News. Through our sharing in the Holy Spirit in baptism and Eucharist we, too, are propelled forth to make Christ manifest in the world.

God is manifested in visible form today by the renewal and the "fire" of all the baptized.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Although Latin America is home to the largest number of Catholics in the world, the Church is experiencing an alarming decline in membership, for a variety of complex reasons. The unstable global economy has played a part, as has a low priest-to-parishioner ratio that makes it difficult to teach the faith and make the sacraments available in a consistent matter. Additionally, migration across the region has ruptured the bonds of family and community in which the Catholic faith is supported and passed down from generation to generation.

This year's **Collection for the Church in Latin America** will be directed towards a comprehensive evangelization effort, as well as towards the formation of seminarians, catechists, and lay ministers in more than 200 dioceses in the southern hemisphere. So many are attuned to alleviating material poverty, which is of course necessary and a part of the Church's efforts anywhere she is present. However, as Mother Teresa once pointed out, life without God is a much greater poverty than any material deprivation.

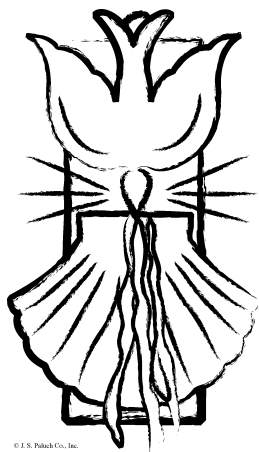

El Bautismo del Señor

DIOS SE MANIFIESTA

Una epifanía es una manifestación de Dios en forma visible. Las Escrituras de hoy están llenas de referencias sobre las formas en que Dios se manifiesta. Isaías ve “la gloria del Señor ...” manifestada en la forma visible en que Dios renueva la alianza al liberar a los israelitas del exilio para conducirlos a su propia tierra. El salmo 104 proclama las numerosas obras de Dios y reconoce al Señor como el creador de todo: “Envías tu espíritu y renuevas la faz de la tierra”. En la lectura de la carta a Tito este tema de la renovación se presenta como una manifestación de Dios. Esta carta menciona tres “apariciones” de Dios –en la persona de Jesús, en la gloria de la plenitud de los tiempos, y en nuestro propio bautismo, por “la renovación del Espíritu Santo”.

Finalmente, Dios se manifiesta en el bautismo de Jesús cuando “el Espíritu Santo bajó sobre Él en forma visible, como una paloma, y se oyó una voz que venía del cielo”.

BAUTIZADO CON EL ESPÍRITU SANTO Y CON FUEGO

¿Qué tienen que ver con nosotros todas estas epifanías? La carta a Tito nos asegura que el mismo Espíritu de Dios que renueva el universo, que renovó la alianza y que descendió sobre Jesús, ha sido derramado abundantemente sobre nosotros, y así Dios nos hace “herederos ... de la vida eterna”. Con Jesús hemos sido bautizados “con el Espíritu Santo y el fuego”.

Aquellos de nosotros que fuimos bautizados de niños no recordamos nuestro bautismo, mucho menos podremos recordar nuestra experiencia de Dios manifestado en nosotros ese día. Sin embargo, cada vez que nuestra comunidad reza la Plegaria Eucarística y comparte la Sagrada Comunión, el Espíritu Santo desciende nuevamente sobre nosotros, y derrama su vida divina, que nos renueva y nos “enciende” con su fuego. Al entrar en el Tiempo Ordinario, escucharemos cómo el Espíritu impulsó a Jesús a proclamar la Buena Nueva. Por nuestra participación en la vida del Espíritu Santo mediante nuestro bautismo, así como por la Eucaristía, nosotros también somos impulsados a manifestar a Dios en el mundo.

Dios se manifiesta hoy en forma visible a través de la renovación y del “fuego” de todos los bautizados.

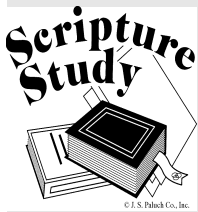
