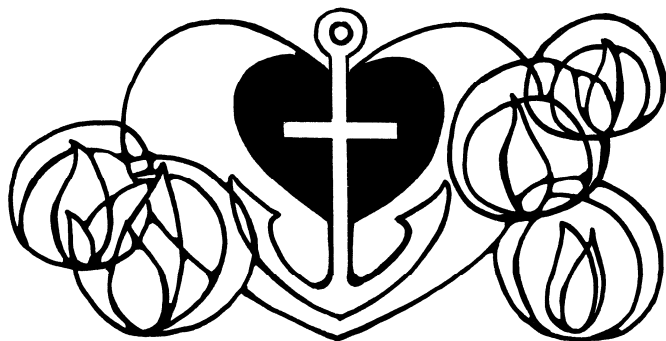

MORE PARISH INFORMATION

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.

BAPTISMS: All Baptism arrangements must be made at the rectory office beforehand. All parents and godparents should be practicing Catholic Christians.

English Baptisms are at 2:30pm on the First and Fourth Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 3rd Monday of the month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

Spanish Baptisms are at 1:00pm on the Second Saturday of each month, or after the 12:30pm Mass on the Second Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 1st Monday of each month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

WEDDINGS: Arrangements need to be made with a parish priest or deacon at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for parishioners, but special situations will be considered.

FUNERALS: Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director. We have the Book of Funeral Readings at the rectory for families who wish to look them over. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

SICK CALLS: If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are seriously ill, don't wait too long. If someone requests Holy Communion, it will usually be brought by a Minister of Care.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome to Sacred Heart Parish! Please register in the rectory office and be counted!

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: IF YOU LEAVE THE PARISH OR MOVE TO A NEW ADDRESS, PLEASE NOTIFY THE RECTORY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

This Tuesday we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. It really belongs in the Christmas Season, but was left dangling by the Council Fathers of the Vatican II at 40 days after Christmas, because at one time it marked the end of the 40 day Christmas Season! It is also called the Feast of the Purification of Mary or Candlemas Day. More about those other titles next year!

Wednesday is the Memorial of Sts. Blaise and Ansgar. Ansgar is rally the more notable churchmen of the two, but Blaise gets the popular devotion because he was a healer! According to tradition he saved a choking child. Individual throat blessings will be given after the 8am Mass on Tuesday.

As you have already heard and will hear again in today's special bulletin insert, it is time again for the Annual Catholic Appeal. I hate to have my hands in your pockets and purses again, but it is for a good cause. The Appeal funds help out a lot of ministries in the Archdiocese. The in-pew appeal will be made at all Masses next weekend, Feb. 6th & 7th. It will follow a short message by the Cardinal. A follow-up in-pew appeal will be made on the weekend of Feb. 13th & 14th. I dislike that one, but we have to do it! So let's be thorough and generous on the first in-pew weekend so we can go through the second one fast!

If you look at the vigil light stands by Mary, you will notice a different container with sand for the lighting sticks. We think it is safer and easier to use. What do you think? Let me know, please! We did this because I have seen a number of times where all the sticks started on fire when a glowing one was returned to the ledge.

In case anyone going out the main rear doors of church is wondering "what happed to Fr. Friedl," I want to tell you that during the cold weather, he is in the "parking lot" vestibule by Mary's Shrine! Fr. Friedl is an old man with a bald head so he is trying to stay warm! Unless one has Mass, there is no inside way to get to the rear vestibule. So if you want to catch up with me, that is where I am!

Once we finish the Annual Catholic Appeal, Ash Wednesday and Lent 2010 lie before us. We have a theme, a symbol and a song!

The Bishop Blasé was martyred in his Episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. Blasé was a good bishop working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Blasé was forced to flee back to his country due to the threat of prosecution, where he lived in solitude and prayer with wild animals. When hunters found Blasé and hauled him off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blasé's command the child was able to cough up the bone. Blasé then was tortured and beheaded.

Catholics Come Home Adult Formation Series in Lent

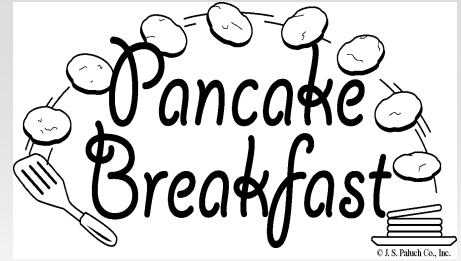
These following parishes will hold a Series for Adult Formation evening meetings during Lent. Each session will focus on a common question about our faith:

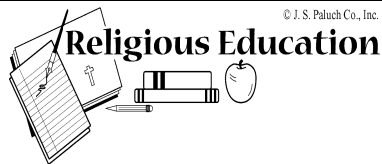

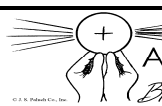

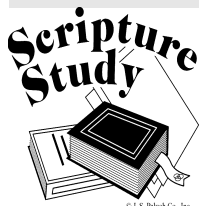
