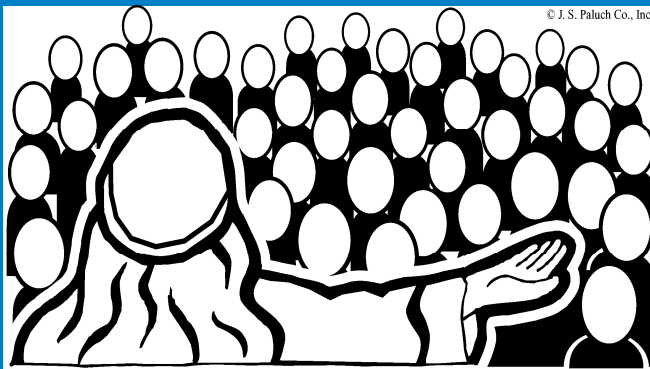

MORE PARISH INFORMATION

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.

BAPTISMS: All Baptism arrangements must be made at the rectory office beforehand. All parents and godparents should be practicing Catholic Christians.

English Baptisms are at 2:30pm on the First and Fourth Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 3rd Monday of the month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

Spanish Baptisms are at 1:00pm on the Second Saturday of each month, or after the 12:30pm Mass on the Second Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 1st Monday of each month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

WEDDINGS: Arrangements must be made at the rectory with a parish priest or deacon at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for parishioners, but special situations will be considered. We recommend a wedding Mass for practicing Catholics. We recommend a Wedding Ceremony for non-practicing Catholics or mixed-religion couples. Both are valid Marriages.

QUICEANERA: Arrangements must be made at the rectory with a priest or deacon at least two months before.

FUNERALS: Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director. We have the Book of Funeral Readings at the rectory for families who wish to look them over. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

SICK CALLS: If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are seriously ill, don't wait too long. If someone requests Holy Communion, it will usually be brought by a Minister of Care.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome to Sacred Heart Parish! Please register in the rectory office and be counted!

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: If you leave the parish or move to a new address, please notify the rectory as soon as possible.

PARISH FOOD PANTRY: Open Saturday's 10am -12 noon. Patrons need to call the rectory by Thursday to reserve food.

Reflections for the Week... (There are many!)

My thanks to everyone for their patience, good nature and good response to the Annual Catholic Appeal. We have one more shorter session today and then we are done. Please be sure to fulfill your pledges, because whatever we get above our assessment goal comes back to the parish!

There is a special bulletin insert about our parish school registration in today's bulletin. It is in English & Spanish. The same insert is hopefully in the bulletins of our 5 neighboring parishes. It will be followed next weekend by representatives of our school in the main church lobbies of all these parishes after each Mass. Please pray for the success of this recruiting effort, because our school needs more students!!!

The three pillars of Lent are (1)Prayer (2)Fasting and (3)Almsgiving as a couple of people correctly told me last weekend! Our Lenten theme for this year is: **"Lift High the Cross!"** Our symbol will be a rough "cross of nails," which will be given out on Ash Wednesday after people are signed with ashes as the Dismissal Rite at the end of Mass. We ask everyone to wear that cross during Lent as a reminder to always follow the cross of Christ which leads us to salvation. Our Lenten theme song of course will be "Lift High the Cross" and will be sung as the Entrance Hymn of all Lenten Masses for the first few weeks. Let us begin our Lenten journey to the Lord, in a spirit of "dying to ourselves and our wants" and rising "to the Lord and His wants"!!!

On Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17th, we will have Masses at 8am, 6:30pm English, and 8pm Spanish. A collection will be taken. Envelopes are in your envelope packets. Ashes will be distributed at the end of each Mass as the Dismissal Rite of Mass. We ask everyone to come to the front of church like for Communion. After you are signed with ashes, please take a cross and wear it for all of Lent.

There will also be an Ash Wednesday Prayer Service at 1:30pm, for the school children. But, anyone is welcome!

Our signing form in this Year II of the Church Year Cycle will be: "Remember You are Dust, and unto Dust You shall return."

On the First Sunday of Lent we will have all kinds of involvement things.

- The Rice Bowls will be given out and Deacon Barnish will ask us to use them!
- The bulletin will contain a Lenten Reflection Pamphlet from Paluch.
- The RCIA members will have their Pre-Recognition Rites at one of the Masses.
- Our school reps will be in the rear of church to answer questions about registration.

On the Fridays of Lent we will have Soup and Bread meals in Marian Hall at 6pm. At 7pm we will have Stations in English. At 8pm we will have Stations in Spanish. A couple of times we will have CCD students join in and everyone will use their Station Books in English or Spanish.

A couple of people have said they enjoy seeing the American Flag and the Papal Flag back in the sanctuary. I do too! It says who we are and what we are!

I have gotten some feedback on the "sand glass" for the lighting sticks at Mary's Shrine. All were positive and thought it was safer and more convenient. So maybe we ought to do the same for St. Joseph. Let me know!

Any feedback or comments about moving up the starting time for the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, on the first Thursday, from 1pm to 12 noon? Please let me know!

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

FAST and ABSTINENCE:The code of Canon Law states that all Christ's faithful are obliged by the Lord's command, each in his or her own way to undertake that conversion of mind and heart called penance. In order that the faithful may join together in a common practice of penance, some days of penance are prescribed. On these days the faithful in a special way devote themselves to prayer, engage in works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially be observing the fast and abstinence the Church prescribes. ***DAYS OF FAST and ABSTINENCE:*** Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. ***DAYS OF ABSTINENCE:*** ALL Fridays in Lent. ***ABSTINENCE:*** Means NOT eating meat, and binds Catholics 14 years of age and older. ***FAST:*** Means LIMITING oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals each day and binds Catholics from their 18th to 59th birthdays. One is not bound to fast if health or the ability to work is affected. **PRAYER** Please try to devote as much time to prayer and reflection as possible. Morning Mass is at 8:00AM every day! Stations of the Cross are prayed every Friday of Lent at 7:00PM in English and 8:00PM in Spanish. **ALMSGIVING** Please try to help the poor during Lent. There are a number of ways. Operation Rice Bowl, Alms for the Poor, bringing clothes for Catholic Charities on the last Sunday, and bringing food for our parish pantry on the second Sunday of the month are all ways we can help the less fortunate. **LIFT HIGH THE CROSS!**
