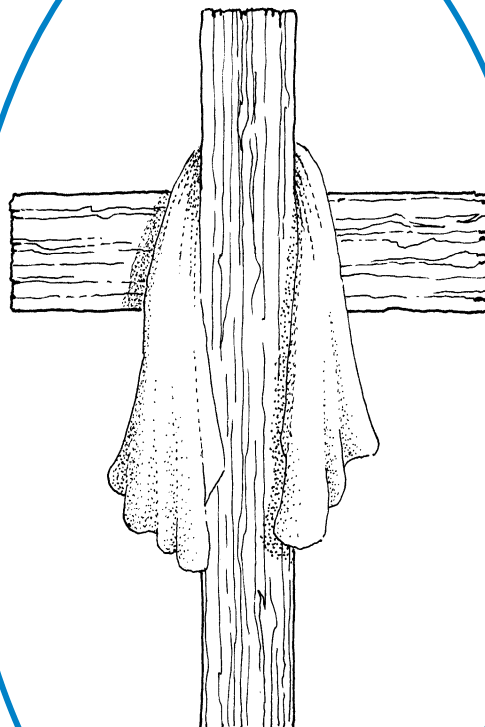

MORE PARISH INFORMATION

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Thursday of each month from 1:00 to 7:00pm, with Benediction at 7:00pm.

BAPTISMS: All Baptism arrangements must be made at the rectory office beforehand. All parents and godparents should be practicing Catholic Christians.

English Baptisms are at 2:30pm on the First and Fourth Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 3rd Monday of the month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

Spanish Baptisms are at 1:00pm on the Second Saturday of each month, or after the 12:30pm Mass on the Second Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 1st Monday of each month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

WEDDINGS: Arrangements must be made at the rectory with a parish priest or deacon at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for parishioners, but special situations will be considered. We recommend a wedding Mass for practicing Catholics. We recommend a Wedding Ceremony for non-practicing Catholics or mixed-religion couples. Both are valid Marriages.

QUICEANERA: Arrangements must be made at the rectory with a priest or deacon at least two months before.

FUNERALS: Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director. We have the Book of Funeral Readings at the rectory for families who wish to look them over. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

SICK CALLS: If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are seriously ill, don't wait too long. If someone requests Holy Communion, it will usually be brought by a Minister of Care.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome to Sacred Heart Parish! Please register in the rectory office and be counted!

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: If you leave the parish or move to a new address, please notify the rectory as soon as possible.

PARISH FOOD PANTRY: Open Saturday's 10am -12 noon. Patrons need to call the rectory by Thursday to reserve food.

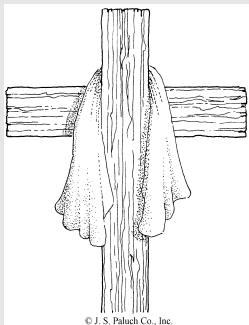

Reflections for the First Week of Lent...

My thanks again for everyone's patience and cooperation for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Please fulfill your pledges throughout the year because as I have said before, whatever is given above our quota comes back to the parish!

We have begun another Season of Lenten Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving! It can and should be a special time of renewal and growth in our relationship with God! There are some people who celebrated Mardi Gras and then began Ash Wednesday in a "party stupor" looking for the next "party" to get into. They will NOT grow in the ways of the Kingdom of God! There is nothing wrong with an enjoyable Mardi Gras celebration. But the whole point is to realize that Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of something radically different. It is a time to begin facing our true selves and the areas that need improvement. It is a time to face our selfishness and sinfulness and to turn away from them in prayer, penance, and works of charity. It is only if we are willing to undergo the discipline of Lent, that we can experience the uplifting grace of Easter. A good and holy Lent to all!

On the First Sunday of Lent we prayed the Pre-Recognition Rites over our RCIA candidates at the 9am Mass. We have a dozen Candidates for Full Initiation into the Catholic Church. That means they were all baptized as Catholics and some even made their First Holy Communion, but they all needed catechetical instruction and preparation for Confirmation and in some cases First Confession and First Communion. Because they are all baptized Catholics, they will receive their Initiation Sacraments (Confirmation and First Communion) on April 24th, when the Bishop comes for Confirmation and not on Holy Saturday Night. Please pray for them and their teachers!

After I just told our Ushers to stop taking the "Sunday Mass Body Count," the archdiocese wants us to take it again! Never fails! But it's only for two Sundays. This Saturday and Sunday, and next weekend. They want to see if the "Catholics Come Home" effort brought more people to church. I suppose no harm in trying!

Talking about Mardi Gras celebrations, our recent Holy Name Society's Corned Beef and Cabbage Dinner and Night at the Races was a very good one! As I said to the guys there, it is like Mardi Gras, St. Patrick's Day and the Kentucky Derby all rolled into one ala Sacred Heart! Congratulations to President Don Klaput, his hard working Holy Name committee and everyone else who helped, including 300+ attendees.

I hope everyone read the special bulletin insert last weekend about Sacred Heart School. I further hope that everyone will help to publicize our good school all over the area in English, Spanish, Polish, etc... Early registration is under way. I hope you visited with one of our school reps in the church lobby today. If not, you can always call the school office at (708) 681-0240. Someday soon our school may ask people to put up lawn signs about Sacred Heart School. Please be willing!

There used to be a clock in the choir loft balcony. A few years ago it broke. It was sent out for repairs but never came back because there were no parts for it. Thus, there was no sense in paying to send it back. I kind of liked a clock there. So I thought I would try another one. It is called an "Old World Roman Clock" and is an "imitation antique" that was made in a very populous nation in northeast Asia!!! What do you think of it?

- It is a nice addition. Let's keep it! -It's ugly and annoying. Take it back! Let me know your thoughts.

Finally, we have a nice Ambry (cabinet) for the Holy Oils in the office and a nice statue of the Baptism of the Lord that is kind of lost in the Cry Room. I asked the Parish Council at the last meeting what they thought about putting them on temporary stands in the sanctuary where they might fit and ask parishioners what they thought about it. The Council said yes. So if you see them in the sanctuary, don't panic. It's not a done deal! It's just so we can all see what they might look like and give our opinions. N.B. The stands are only temporary. They would not be there. The items would be on shelves attached to the wall.

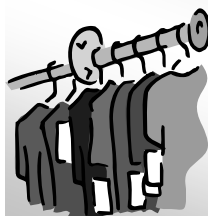

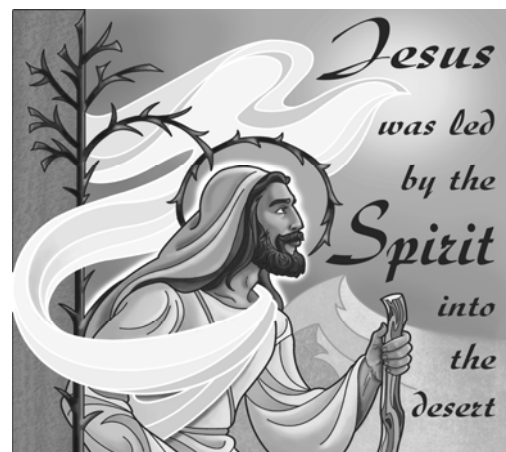
