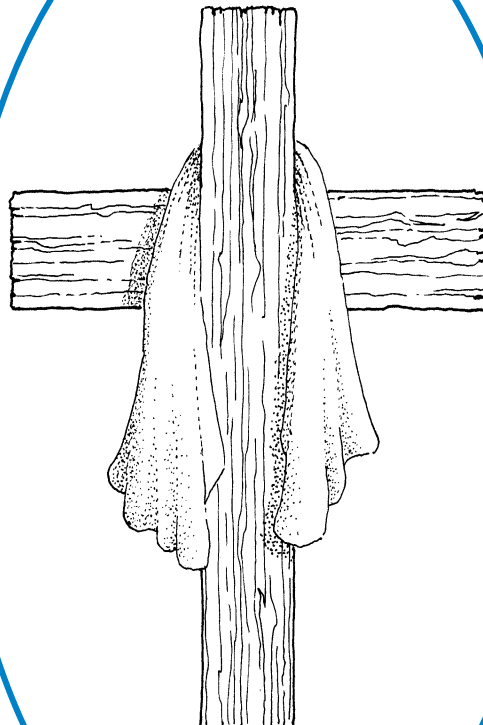

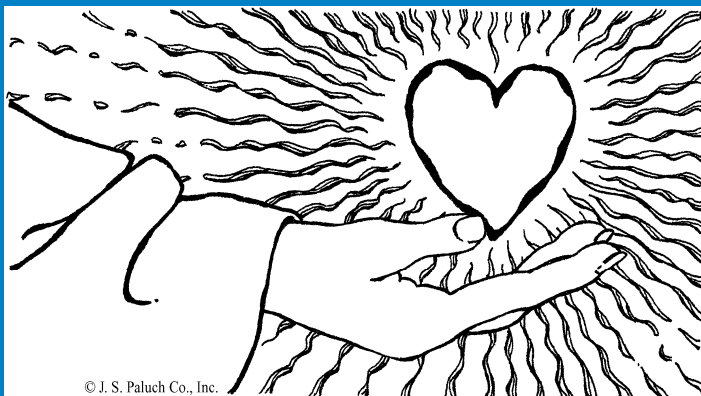

MORE PARISH INFORMATION

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Thursday of each month from 12 Noon to 7pm. Exposition at 12 Noon: Adoration until 7pm: Benediction at 7:00pm.

BAPTISMS: All Baptism arrangements must be made at the rectory office beforehand. All parents and godparents should be practicing Catholic Christians.

English Baptisms are at 2:30pm on the First and Fourth Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 3rd Monday of the month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

Spanish Baptisms are at 1:00pm on the Second Saturday of each month, or after the 12:30pm Mass on the Second Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents and godparents is on the 1st Monday of each month, at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

WEDDINGS: Arrangements must be made at the rectory with a parish priest or deacon at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for parishioners, but special situations will be considered. We recommend a Wedding Mass for practicing Catholics. We recommend a Wedding Ceremony for non-practicing Catholics or mixed-religion couples. Both are valid Marriages.

QUINCEANERA: Arrangements must be made at the rectory with a priest or deacon at least two months before.

FUNERALS: Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director. We have the Book of Funeral Readings at the rectory for families who wish to look them over. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

SICK CALLS: If someone needs to be anointed, please call the rectory when they are seriously ill, don't wait too long. If someone homebound wishes Holy Communion, please call the rectory. It will usually be brought by a Minister of Care.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome to Sacred Heart Parish! Please register in the rectory office and be counted!

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: If you leave the parish or move to a new address, please notify the rectory as soon as possible.

PARISH FOOD PANTRY: Open Saturday's 10am -12 noon. Patrons need to call the rectory by Thursday to reserve food.

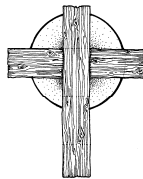

Thoughts for the Third Week of Lent...

As always, the days of Lenten prayer, fasting and almsgiving are going by in a hurry. I hope all of us have committed to something to make this a special preparation time for the joyous Feast of Easter. My special efforts are a bit of fasting, almsgiving and praying and walking the Way of the Cross with the Lord every Friday of Lent. I say that not to brag but to give a simple example of what we can do to make Lent special. It is never too late to start!

Talking about the Stations (Way) of the Cross this coming Friday, March 12th, they will be special! At both the 7pm English Stations and the 8pm Spanish Stations we have invited all the CCD (Religious Education) children and their parents. We will be using their prayer books for the Stations and ask everyone to join in. We want to give our CCD students at least one experience this Lent of praying the Stations of the Cross. Maybe in the future we can do more. If we don't teach them and pray with them, who will???

We hope to have some new Spanish language Station Prayer-books soon. We hope they will help everyone at the 8pm Service to pray much better!

Since no one found it a problem, we will begin Adoration on the First Thursday of the month at 12 Noon and go to 7pm. Exposition will be at noon, Adoration all afternoon, and Benediction at 7pm. All are welcome to come and spend time with the Lord!!!

You may have noticed some new devices on the west church doors to keep them open. They are called panic bar retainers. We put them on for a couple of reasons. First of all, when they are in place you can just pull the door open and come in. You don't need to push down on the "tab" to open it. Some of those tabs worked very hard for older people. Secondly, we don't need to give so many keys out. People can come in through the rectory and sacristy, set the retainer, let people in, and release the retainer when they go. Thirdly, it is easier to see if the door is locked or not. With the key sometimes the door was unlocked and people walked away thinking it was locked. The big thing now is for everyone to learn how to use them properly. If in doubt ask one of the priests, Joe, Mike, or any "handy" person.

The final "clock tally" was about five to one in favor. Therefore the "ayes" have it. I also respect to opinions of those who dissented. I will now go ahead and have it electrified so we don't have to keep feeding it batteries because we have an outlet right there. It will also have a mechanism that automatically sets it to daylight saving time etc., so we don't have to keep pulling it up and down to reset the time. Finally, the clock, humble but with character, is my "housewarming" gift to the parish for all of your kindnesses in welcoming me back to Sacred Heart. So even if you didn't like it, you have the satisfaction of knowing you didn't have to pay for it!!! That should be worth some consolation!!! Thus endeth the saga of the clock (I hope!)

Now on to the Ambry and the Lord's Baptism. I have received about a dozen comments, all positive. One person had reservations about the location of the Ambry. The others thought it was good. What do you think? Let me know.

Today's Mass Readings start out with the hopeful calling of Moses to set the Hebrews free. By the time of the Gospel Jesus is announcing condemnation and doom over the people. What brought that on? Worth thinking about.
