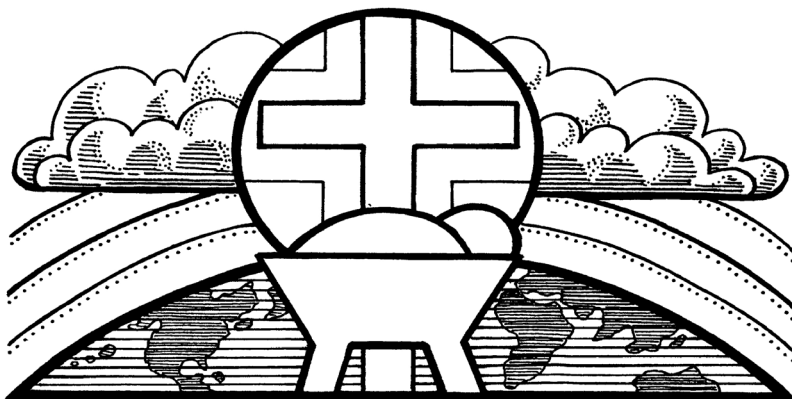

PARISH INFORMATION

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION: The first Friday of each month from 12:00 Noon to 7pm. Exposition at 12 Noon: Adoration until 7pm: Benediction at 7:00pm

BAPTISMS: All Baptism arrangements for English Baptisms must be made at the rectory office beforehand. All arrangements for Spanish Baptisms may be made with Deacon Norberto Ojeda after 12:30 Sunday Mass or at the Spanish Baptism preparation meeting. All godparents are expected to be believing and practicing Christians who will raise the child in the Catholic Church. At least one parent & godparent MUST be a practicing Catholic Christian.

English Baptisms are at 2:30pm on the First & Fourth Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents & godparents is on the 4th Monday of the month (except holidays), at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

Spanish Baptisms are at 1:00pm on the Second Saturday of each month, or after the 12:30pm Mass on the Second Sunday of each month. The "must attend" preparation meeting for parents & godparents is on the 1st Monday of each month (except holidays), at 7:00pm, at the rectory.

WEDDINGS: Arrangements should be made at the rectory with a parish priest or deacon at least four months before the wedding. Normally weddings are for parishioners, but special situations will be considered. We recommend a Wedding Mass for practicing Catholics. We recommend a Wedding Ceremony for non-practicing Catholics or mixed religion couples. Both are valid marriages. A priest is necessary for a Wedding Mass.

QUINCEANERA: To have a Quinceanera Mass, a candidate must have been Confirmed & received First Holy Communion. Others will have the Prayer Service & Blessing. A deacon can preside at a Prayer Service & Blessing. All Quinceaneras must be baptized as Catholic Christians. Arrangements must be made at the rectory with a priest or deacon at least two months before.

FUNERALS: Arrangements can usually be made with the rectory office by the funeral director. We have the Book of Funeral Readings at the rectory for families who wish to look them over. A priest or deacon will usually attend the wake.

SICK CALLS: If someone needs to be Anointed, please call the rectory when they are seriously ill. Don't wait too long! If someone homebound wishes Holy Communion, please call the rectory. It will usually be brought by a Minister of Care.

NEW PARISHIONERS: Welcome to Sacred Heart Parish! Please register in the rectory office to be counted!

CHANGE OF ADDRESS: If you leave the parish or move to a new address, please notify the rectory as soon as possible

PARISH FOOD PANTRY: Open Saturday's 10am-11:30am. Patrons need to call the rectory by Thursday to reserve food

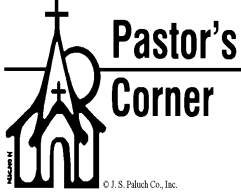

We follow the Lord in Ordinary Time . . .

Our last Parish Council Meeting was rather productive. We need to let the parish at large know the results. First, as I have already reported, the Council approved a new missalette with both an English and Spanish section. We are preparing the hymnal racks for the new missalettes by widening them a bit. These new missalettes should save us money, save us work, and save us bother. We hope you will all like them!

The second thing the Council discussed was our poor Mass attendance on Christmas Day. It seems like a lot of people have forgotten that Christmas is a holyday of obligation! The 5pm Mass was well attended. The 10pm so-so. The 7:30am about 15 souls! The 9am and 11am so-so. The 12:30 Spanish Mass also so-so. It is obvious there is no need for 6 Masses on Christmas Day! We need to keep the Spanish Mass, but the 5 English Masses are too many!

Therefore, the Parish Council decided that for Christmas Day 2014 the 7:30am Mass will be dropped. The pastor agrees. It is hardly a festive Christmas liturgy with 15 souls! Please book any intentions for that Mass at 9am.

The Council also decided that people should be asked whether more of them would attend the "10pm Christmas Eve Mass" if it were moved back to 11pm or midnight? Please let me or Council members know.

Finally, the Council voted in an updated schedule for New Year's Day Masses, when it is a holyday of obligation. Masses will be offered at 5pm on New Year's Eve, and 10am and 12:30pm Spanish on New Year's Day. We hope this works better for everyone!

As I wrote recently in the bulletin, I asked the diocese to postpone the Capital Campaign to 2016 because of my health issues. That has been done. But, what that means is that we need to do the Annual Archdiocesan Appeal again this year! We are starting publicity now and the "in-bench" Appeal by me will be in late February. Please be open to the Appeal as all the funds are spent by the diocese on legitimate ministerial expenses. Thank you for your support and more details later!

My thanks to the Hispanic Committee for a recent \$1,000 donation to the parish. Mucho Gracias! It will be put to good use!

We could use some new members on our Parish Liturgy Committee. The Committee plans seasons and services with themes, decorations and symbols. Please see Randy Cerqua or Fr. Friedl if you are interested.

We recently got a letter from the local coordinator of Catholic-Relief Services telling us what C.R.S. has done in response to the typhoon in the Philippines. They have, and we quote:

- "distributed tarps and hygiene kits to over 10,000 families;
- provided emergency shelters, household supplies and clean water to over 100,000 families;
- and are planning a long-term income recovery period."

"This long-term recovery period includes cash-for-work to remove debris, install water tanks, restore rice and coconut agriculture, and provide access to permanent housing."

She expresses thanks to everyone who has helped C.R.S. do this good work.

Next week we will publish the response of the Archdiocese to the recent release of records of priestly abuse of minors. It will hopefully give the matter a little perspective.

CHRIST OUR LIGHT

When we say that Christ is the Light of the World we think of the “Sun” of justice and peace that dawned when Jesus was born as a human being. We think of the light that pierced and destroyed the darkness of sin and death when Jesus died on the cross. We can also think of the lamp that shines on our lives and goes before us on our journey. Christ our Light can reveal our true selves to us—in all our goodness and weakness. He can illuminate the paths ahead of us, helping us to see which one God is beckoning us to take.

Today’s Gospel provides four examples of persons who sought and followed the light. Simeon and Anna devoted themselves to following the light of the law and seeking the light of the promised Messiah. Joseph and Mary followed the law by presenting Jesus to God and offering up two turtledoves. One day the light of Christ would lead them to offer up their only son. All four, in their own ways, recognized and followed the light. Each endured sacrifices and testing along the way and each one was refined “like gold or like silver” so that they themselves could give glory to God.

CHRIST OUR HELP

If we try to follow closely the white-hot Light of the World we, too, will be refined and purified along the way. We may also be tested, as Jesus was, and faced with sacrifices. Those daily sacrifices and tests may seem small in comparison to Jesus’ suffering, yet they are what make us Christians. Day by day, Christ our Light can reveal to us what we must do. Christ our Help can then free us from fear, giving us the courage to follow the trail he has blazed for us.

We can always rely on Christ for help as we seek to follow the Light of the World.

INFORMACION PARROQUIAL

ADORACION EUCARISTICA: El primer Viernes de cada mes de 12-7pm. Exposición a las 12pm; Adoración y Bendición a las 7pm.

BAUTISMOS: Todos los arreglos para bautismos en inglés DEBEN hacerse en la rectoría de antemano. Todos los arreglos para bautismos en español DEBEN hacerse con el diácono Norberto Ojeda en la plática de bautismo o después de misa de 12:30pm los domingos. Todos los padres y Padrinos deben ser creyentes y Católicos cristianos practicantes para que así inculquen a sus niños la fe católica. Aunque el requisito mínimo es que por lo menos un padre de familia y un/a padrino/madrina DEBE de ser practicante católico cristiano (a). **Los Bautismos en inglés** son a las 2:30pm el 1er & 4to Domingo del mes. La Preparación "requerida" para padres & padrinos el 4to lunes de cada mes (excepto cuando sea día conmemorativo) a las 7pm en la rectoría. **Los Bautismos en español** son a la 1pm el 2do sábado de cada mes, o después de misa de 12:30pm el 2do domingo de cada mes. La preparación "requerida" para padres y padrinos es el 1er lunes de cada mes a las 7pm, en la rectoría.

MATRIMONIOS: Arreglos para la boda deben hacerse en la rectoría con un sacerdote o diácono por lo menos cuatro meses con anticipación. Normalmente se hacen matrimonios para feligreses aunque se pueden considerar situaciones especiales. Les recomendamos un matrimonio con Misa a católicos practicantes. Recomendamos el rito matrimonial para católicos no practicantes o parejas mixtas de otras religiones. Las dos formas son matrimonios válidos. El sacerdote es necesario para el matrimonio con misa.

QUINCEANERA: Para tener una Misa, la candidata DEBE de haber sido confirmada & haber recibido la 1ra Comunión. Las demás, solo tendrán un servicio de oración & Bendición. Todas las quinceañeras deben ser bautizadas católicas cristianas. Arreglos deben hacerse en la rectoría con un sacerdote o diácono, mínimo con dos meses de anticipación.

FUNERALES: Arreglos pueden hacerse con la oficina parroquial a través del director de la funeraria. Tenemos un libro con las lecturas para funerales para las familias que quieran mirarlas. Un sacerdote o diácono presidirá el funeral.

LLAMADAS POR ENFERMEDAD: Si alguien necesita ser Ungido, favor de llamarnos a la rectoría cuando la persona esté enferma de seriedad. ¡No esperes hasta que sea demasiado tarde! Si alguien en nuestra área desea que se le lleve la Santa Comunión, llámenos a la rectoría, un ministro de enfermos será el encargado.

NUEVOS FELIGRESES: ¡Bienvenidos al Sagrado Corazón! favor de inscribirse en la oficina en la rectoría para que podamos realmente contar con usted y viceversa.

CANBIO DE DIRECCION: Si dejas nuestra parroquia o te mueves a otra dirección, notifícanos tan pronto como puedas a la rectoría.

ALAZENA DE COMIDA PARROQUIAL: Se abre el sábado de 10-11:30am. Si necesita comida llámenos a la rectoría no después del jueves para prepararte tu comida de antemano.

Seguimos al Señor en el tiempo litúrgico ordinario...

En nuestra última reunión del Concejo Pastoral se decidieron cosas importantes. Debemos darles a conocer a los feligreses en general los resultados. Ya les había mencionado que el Concejo aprobó un misal nuevo en inglés y español. Estamos preparando el lugar de los himnos para ampliarlo así, ahorramos dinero, trabajo y evitamos inconformidades. ¡Espero que les guste a la mayoría! La Segunda cosa que el Concejo acordó fue en relación a la poca asistencia el día de Navidad. Parece que la mayoría de las personas han olvidado que el día de Navidad es un día de Obligación. La misa de las 5pm tuvo buena asistencia y la de las 10pm más o menos; 7:30am como 15 personas; de 9am y 11am más o menos. A las 12:30pm en español tuvo poca asistencia. Es obvio que no hay necesidad de 6 misas el día de Navidad. Necesitamos continuar con la misa en español. Pero las 5 misas en inglés son demasiado.

Por lo tanto, el Concejo Pastoral decidió que el día de Navidad se elimine la misa de las 7:30am. El pastor está de acuerdo. Es muy difícil que sea una celebración festiva con 15 almas. Favor de escribir sus intenciones para la misa de las 9am. El Concejo también decidió que se les debe consultar con respecto a si asistirían a una misa de Noche buena a las 11pm en vez de a las 10pm? Favor de dejarme saber o a algún miembro del Concejo.

Finalmente, el Concejo votó para actualizar el horario de misas para el año nuevo, cuando sea día de Precepto u obligación. Se ofrecerán misas a las 5pm el día anterior, a las 10am y 12:30 en español el día de año nuevo. Espero que esto funcione mejor para todos.

Como ya les mencioné anteriormente le pedí a la arquidiócesis que pospusiera la Campaña de Capital hasta el 2016 porque no he estado bien de salud y lo han aceptado.
