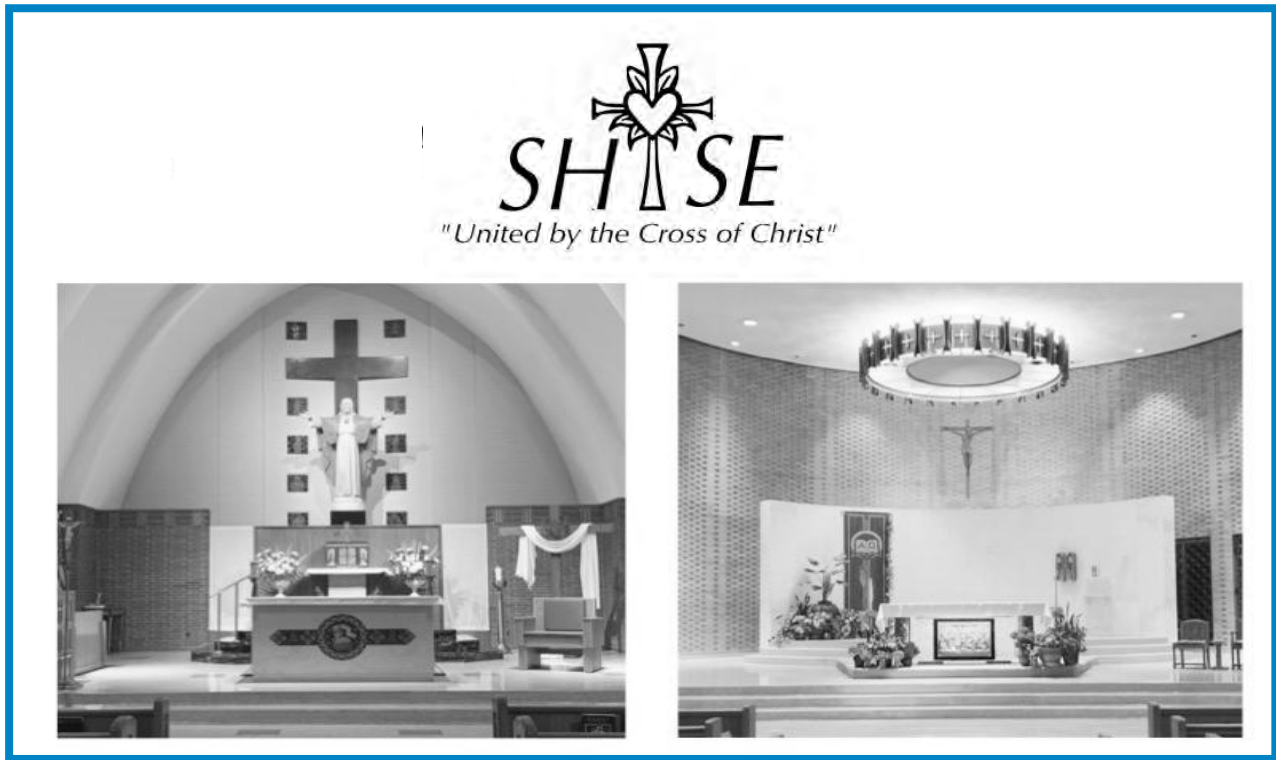

### **Fighting Domestic Violence During the COVID-19 Crisis**

DV hotline calls have increased; check on those who may need help during this crisis. Experience and data teach us that financial crises, home confinement and prolonged stress exacerbate the frequency and intensity of domestic violence. It is no surprise that the COVID-19 pandemic has made life more dangerous for many already at risk in our country. The Illinois Domestic Violence Hotline reports that calls for help have increased 50% in March, from 60 to 90 a day. Some victims were about to leave their abuser, but now he is home all the time, and they have less opportunity to free themselves. Some are in counseling, and now in-person services are unavailable. Some abusers are more angry by loss of work or home quarantine and thus more threatening to their partners.

# Third Sunday of Easter

## AND IT HAPPENED THAT . . .

The two major components of today's familiar Gospel hinge on this phrase: "And it happened that . . ." But what monumental moments of grace that seemingly insignificant phrase introduces! The first time it appears, the risen Christ joins the disciples on their journey. The second time, he joins them at table and breaks bread with them. Twice also there are "openings" in this passage. The first is the opening of the scriptures to the disciples, which will help them realize that through this "breaking open" of God's inspired word their hearts came to burn with the fire of faith. Second, the breaking of the bread causes their eyes to be opened, so that they recognize Christ with them. And so it happens, each and every Lord's Day, as it happened on this "first day of the week," that in the opening of the word and



the breaking of the bread, we come to know Christ with us.

## FINDING GOD IN BROKEN THINGS

The two disciples were having trouble, as many of us still do today, finding the presence of God in broken things. The body of their Lord had been broken on a cross. They were confused at the broken seal on the tomb—not yet understanding what this meant—thinking perhaps that the grave had been desecrated. Their dreams of the reign of God that Jesus had preached were broken, too. Luke tells us they were "downcast." They were surely not expecting to find God's presence in this stranger on the road whom they did not recognize. But as they continued on their journey with him, his sharing of the scriptures inspired them to keep him as companion, and at their table he became the host. Then grace was present, known, seen, and believed in the broken bread. Their joy overcame their fear of traveling after nightfall (a dangerous undertaking in that time and place), and they sped to Jerusalem to share their good news. We, too, must journey with Jesus, allow him to open our eyes and set our hearts on fire. Then, overcoming all our fears in joyful faith, we must continue on as messengers of the gospel.

# Tercer Domingo de Pascua

## AQUEL MISMO DÍA . . .

Los dos componentes principales del evangelio tan familiar de hoy giran sobre esta frase: “Aquel mismo día . . .”. ¡Pero a qué momentos tan monumentales de gracia esta frase aparentemente insignificante sirve de umbral! El primer momento es cuando Cristo resucitado se une a los discípulos mientras van de camino. La segunda ocasión es cuando él se sienta a la mesa con ellos y parte el pan. También se dan dos “aperturas” en este pasaje del evangelio. La primera sucede cuando Jesús les “abre” o explica las Escrituras y el corazón de ellos arde con la llama de la fe. La segunda es cuando “se les abrieron los ojos” al reconocer a Jesús al partir el pan. Y así sucede, cada día del Señor, como sucedió “aquel mismo día” que al abrir la Palabra y en la fracción del pan reconocemos a Cristo entre nosotros.



## ENCONTRAR A DIOS EN MEDIO DE LOS QUEBRANTOS

Los dos discípulos, al igual que muchos de nosotros hoy, tenían dificultad en encontrar la presencia de Dios en medio de una situación quebrantadora. Habían quebrado el cuerpo de su Señor en la cruz. Estaban confusos ante la tumba abierta –todavía sin saber lo que eso significaba– pensando quizás que habían cometido sacrilegio con el sepulcro. Sus sueños del reino de Dios que Jesús había predicado se habían roto también. Lucas nos dice que estaban “tristes”. Seguramente no esperaban encontrar la presencia de Dios en ese forastero caminante a quien no reconocieron. Pero mientras seguían su camino junto a él, la explicación de la Escritura que les dio los inspiró a pedirle que se quedara con ellos y hasta lo invitaron a compartir su mesa. Fue entonces, en la fracción del pan y porque la gracia estuvo presente, que llegaron a entender, ver y creer. Su alegría venció su miedo de viajar después del anochecer (una empresa muy peligrosa en aquel tiempo y lugar) y partieron de prisa hacia Jerusalén para compartir la Buena Nueva. También nosotros tenemos que caminar con Jesús, dejar que él abra nuestros ojos y haga arder nuestro corazón. Entonces, venciendo todos nuestros temores con una fe alegre, debemos seguir adelante como mensajeros del evangelio.
